Become a School of Kindness

When kindness is shared, it grows. Your kindness is needed now more than ever!

Winter is an especially hard time for people who are homeless. Add to this the cost-of-living crisis; it is affecting us all, but for homeless and vulnerable people, the impact is devastating. More people are facing homelessness than ever before, including families with children.

Through taking part in the Festival of Kindness this year with your school, you can make a real difference for people enduring a desperate winter.

In the Festival of Kindness, we collect donations, essential items, and gifts to distribute to those most in need and support delivering a hot Christmas dinner service on Christmas Eve and Day. There are festive trees in city centres across the country, but you can also take part in the Festival in your local area too.

In 2022, thanks to generous support, the Festival of Kindness campaign resulted in 439,750 Christmas meals, food packs, gifts, and essential items for people affected by homelessness and food poverty.

Have your own Tree of Kindness

Focus your activities around your Tree, by adding donations and messages to it. Help spread the word about what you're doing by having your Tree in the middle of your school.





Give a Gift

We have a wishlist of gifts we need this Festive period. Can your school organise a collection of these and donate them to one of our Trees of Kindness? We can invite a small group of School representatives to visit the tree and donate your schools gifts. Get in touch to let us know you're collecting and we can arrange a drop off day.





Host a Christmas Jumper Day

Organise a dress down day.
It could be a non-uniform
day, fancy dress or Christmas
Jumper themed. Encourage
donations for taking part, and
why not host an assembly to tell
the pupils more about the issue
of homelessness and Festival of
Kindness.



Organise a Festive 5K or Mile Walk

Your school's walk could be around the school field or even a walk to school day. You could make it more exciting and all wear Santa Hats or Reindeer ears!

Host a Festive Concert

If you host a Concert, Panto or Show at school ask all those coming along to donate to your school's Festival of Kindness Campaign or add an optional donation to your ticket sales.





Host a Christmas Movie Day

Put on your favourite Christmas movie in the school hall (at lunch or after school) and have a donation collection at your movie event. Why not add in a costume competition for those attending as well?





Christmas Quiz

Test your knowledge and organise a quiz during one of your classes. Who can name all of Santa's reindeer?

Charge an entry fee to have fun while getting thinking caps on and raising some money.

Launch a 12 Days of Christmas campaign in school. Every day pupils are encouraged to deliver an act of kindness. One day could be collecting gifts, another could be writing messages of kindness to each other, perhaps ending with a visit to one of our Trees of Kindness.

Donations will also be used to develop longer term programs providing homes, jobs, and food to break the cycle of homelessness throughout 2024

Bring a gift to the Tree of Kindness



You can donate a present to someone who is homeless or vulnerable and place it under the tree along with a personal message of kindness.

Donated items will be placed in weather-proof perspex boxes and collected each evening for transportation to a secure location nearby. We will work with our network of local charity partners to distribute the gifts to homeless people, families, and children in poverty in the community.

The following items have been identified by people experiencing homelessness and support staff as the gifts that will have the biggest impact:

- Warm Gloves & Hats (Children/Adults)
- Warm Clothes (Children/Adults)
- Walking Boots/ Trainers
- Children's Toys
- Soaps & Toiletries
- Blankets
- Winter Jackets & Raincoats (Children/ Adults)
- Beauty & Grooming Products

- Hot Water Bottles
- Family Board Games
- Arts & Crafts Sets
- Mobile Phone Top ups & Sim Cards
- Thermos Flasks
- Supermarket vouchers
- Sleeping bags
- Torches
- Earphones

Don't:

- X Give alcohol
- Provide home-baking
- X Drop off the goods outwith advertised opening times for the trees
- X Give second hand goods
- X Bring wrapped gifts. For safety reasons and to help us ensure the gift gets to the right person, we ask that the gifts you donate should not be wrapped. We will make sure they are wrapped ahead of being gifted to the recipient though.
